

Community responds to United Way's plea – over \$20,000 raised in 2 weeks

Having announced a \$40,000 shortfall on November 25th, the United Way is happy to announce that the community has stepped up to help. As of December 12th, the shortfall has shrunk to \$20,000.

Shortly after revealing the news of the shortfall, local businessman, Wayne Branchaud, challenged the community to follow his lead and step up for Brant United Way.
